

Wedding florals guide

To make deciding on your wedding flowers a less overwhelming process, you can generally split floral pieces into two categories: flowers for people and flowers for the space.

Here's some of the traditional pieces that make up the wedding floral scheme, but this is by no means either a list to tick off or a boundary to stay within.

People

- Bridal bouquet
- Bridesmaid posies
- Buttonholes or pocket squares (for groom, groomsmen, page boys and any other guests you would like to give one to)
- Corsages (traditionally for female family members)
- Flower crown (for anyone that wants their head dressed in flowers!)
- Wands or petal baskets (usually for flower girls)
- Hair combs
- Wrist corsages

Space

- Table centrepieces, such as large vases, bud vase clusters, tabletop urns or plinths and flat wreaths
- Aisle arrangements (small floral meadows pieces to line the aisle)
- Pedestals/floorstanding arrangements e.g. large urns, milk churns, or smaller arrangements on plinths
- Floral arches (either fully dressed with flowers or partly)
- long and low tabletop pieces (to trail over the front of a sweetheart table, registrar table or alter)

There are many more options and ideas that can be created for your wedding - the main thing to remember is that there are no rules to where you need flowers but wherever you put them they will undoubtedly add to your special day.
